

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Synopsis

Zì (Uncle) Antonio and zì Vincenzo, two old brothers with a big passion in common: the zampogna (bagpipe).

Constructor the first one, player the second, they still spend their life building bagpipes and playing all around Italy during Festivals.

This year a big surprise: they have been contacted from a Ethnomusicology teacher to record a CD. The documentary follows their trip but also their everyday life, spent in mountain, with zi Carmela, the strong wife of Zi Antonio, and Cardillo, the dog who howls to the bagpipes.

With dignity and irony, but also with an extraordinary will of life, all the characters of this documentary bring us in another world, where the music has for them a special meaning.

Biography

Rossella Schillaci (Torino, 1973) earned a master degree in visual anthropology and documentary direction at the University of Manchester. Her student film, *Ascuntami*, gained an award at the Torino Film Festival and has been screened at various European festivals. She then works for a documentary society production, *Laranja Azul*, in Lisbon. Now she is working as researcher and filmmaker for an anthropological and social history archives in Milan and as assistant director in TV productions (for Rai and Mediaset). She has been selected to participate to the *EU-India documentary project*, an European project undertaken by The Thomson Foundation. Currently she is editing for this project *Living beyond borders*, the documentary realised with an Indian co-director.
